Code of Conduct

Conduct with Judges

Judges work on a voluntary basis and throughout the year give many hours of personal time to judging at Clubs and other organisations. Each Judge has significant experience within the photographic field and in critically analysing images.

Members may not always agree with the comments offered by a Judge, but they are requested to reflect on the comments and to consider if there has been a valid and helpful comment offered. Members, whilst welcome to discuss an image with the Judge, must, at all times, be courteous and respectful in these discussions. It is suggested that these discussions take place after the Judges' Feedback Session has been completed.

Conduct within the Club

Members must at all times be totally respectful of other members and display a courteous, friendly and helpful manner in contact with other members. A member should treat another member and visitors to the Club with the respect they would wish to receive themselves. Aggressive and abusive behaviour has no place within the Club.

Penalty

Whilst the Committee would be extremely reluctant to invoke a penalty, failure to comply with this Code will cause the member to initially receive a warning and any further transgression will result in immediate cancellation of membership.

Club Program Calendar

The program calendar is available on the clubs website and contains details of club meetings, club competitions, outings, workshops and presentations, interclub competitions and annual exhibitions. 2. Club Competitions

Monthly Competitions

General Information

The club meets on the first (1st) and third (3rd) Monday of each month. At the first meeting of the month, competition entries are submitted and Image Critiques occur at the first (1st) meeting of the next month. Occasionally there may be variations to the schedule due to changes in the Club's overall calendar.

Only current Financial Members are eligible to enter these competitions.

Entries should be submitted to the Competition Director during the meeting on or prior to the 1st Monday of each month (check the Club's Calendar for variations). **Guidelines are outlined on the club website** > *Competitions* link.

For digital images submitted by USB drive or email please ensure that you label the USB device with your member number, phone number and email address. Digital images can also be submitted via email to competitions@redlandscameraclub.com. **Entries must be submitted by the specified due date.**

The competition shall be conducted in the following grades:

Colour or Mono Print	A, AB, B with Senior and Junior Youth Grades
Projected Images	A, AB, B with Senior and Junior Youth Grades

New Members

New Members may not compete in graded Print or Projected Image competitions until a grade has been allotted to them. This is currently carried out by Noel Clark and Pia Jessen (2018). Professional photographers are automatically placed in A Grade.

To receive a grade, a new Member should submit a minimum of four (4) to a maximum of six (6) prints and/or digital projected images for appraisal. Images may be submitted by email/CD/DVD/USB or print to either the Competition Director <u>competitiondirector@redlandscameraclub.org.au</u> or to Pia Jessen <u>pia@piajessen.com</u>. Images for grading must be of a reasonable size (digital files must be a minimum of 1920 x 1200 pixels and prints must be no smaller than A4 size).

One grade will be allocated for all sections.

Members have the right to seek to have their grading reviewed at any time. This may be arranged by contacting the Competitions Director at <u>competitions@redlandscameraclub.org.au</u>.

Grades are also reviewed at the end of each year, taking into account members' images, competition standings and exhibition results.

Competition Number

Each Member is allocated a Membership/Competition number on joining the Club which must be marked on the back of their competition entries (prints) or their disc and cover (digital entries submitted by CD/DVD) and included in the naming of digital images (as outlined in the naming convention in the next section).

RULES

- All images must have been taken by the entrant. All image manipulation and included graphics must also be their own work. Each entry must be clearly labelled (back of the print) or named (digital image) with the Section/Subject entered, Grade, Image Title, and Member's Membership Number. The top of the print should also be indicated by an arrow. Digital images must be appropriately named.
- **2.** Visit the Competition link on the club website for details of competition topics for the year and for precise entry and judging dates.
- **3.** Lodge all entries with the Competitions Director at the Club **NO LATER THAN** the scheduled club night one month prior to the Competition Judging. See above under '*Competitions General Information*' if unable to attend the meeting.
- **4.** All eligible club members with a club grade of B and AB may submit a TOTAL of two (2) images in any one month. This total can be split between Prints &/or Projected images but must not exceed 2 images.
- 5. All eligible club members with a club grade of A may submit a TOTAL of one (1) image in any one month. This total can be within the Print or Projected images.
- **6. Prints:** Prints must be a minimum of 8" x 10 inches and up to 18" x 12 inches. Images may be colour or black & white. All prints may be non-owner processed (i.e. printed at a commercial outlet). Members are encouraged to mount prints on matte board as it enhances the presentation of images; Matts can be re-used.

Prints must be labelled on the back of the print in the bottom left corner containing the following information:

Competition Topic (e.g. Open, Transportation etc.) Member Grade Image Title Member Number

It also has to have an arrow indicating the orientation of the image, eg pointing in the direction that you want this image stood for viewing.

PLEASE NOTE: When the print is viewed, text, copyright information & image titles **MUST NOT** be included within or visible in or on the front of Prints. The Competitions Director reserves the right to reject an image if it does not satisfy the club rules.

Projected Digital images should be lodged via USB stick or via email to the Competitions Director. Digital Images must be submitted as sRGB JPG files. Images must be **1920 pixels on the horizontal side and/or 1200 pixels on the vertical side**. This is the screen size used by club projector.

To be fair to new members the Committee will allow two incorrectly sized images to be submitted to the Club's monthly competitions; however subsequent images will be rejected unless they conform to the size regulations.

Name the files in the following competition format:

"TOPIC (e.g. Open, Transportation etc.) - Grade - Title – Member Name - Member Number.jpg" e.g, "OPEN-AB-Story Bridge-Mary Smith-555.jpg". Please ensure you use Sentence Case/Lowercase.

PLEASE NOTE: Text, copyright information & image titles **MUST NOT** be included within or visible in or on Digital Projected Images or Prints. The Competitions Director reserves the right to reject an image if it does not satisfy the club rules.

- 7. An identical image, regardless of format (Print, Slide or Digital Projected Image) may be used in only one monthly competition and once in the Club's Annual Exhibition with the exception of NON-ACCEPTED ("Entered") entries, which may be re-submitted in one further monthly competition.
- **8.** Given that the images are displayed in the Church for judging purposes you are requested to use discretion in the images submitted. The Competition Director reserves the right to reject an image if thought inappropriate.

Annual Competitions

The Club may hold Exhibitions during the year. Members should check the Club's website for details including closing dates. Club Members are encouraged to enter the exhibition.

Redlands Schools Exhibition of Photography

The **Redlands Schools** Exhibition of Photography will be held annually. *Entries are restricted to Club Members and Redland City residents.*

Redlands International Exhibition of Photography

The Redlands **International** Photographic Exhibition will be held annually. This Exhibition is run under the auspices of APS as well as recognised International Photographic organisations. Entries come from around Australia and Internationally as well as Club Members and the general public.

Entry forms may be downloaded from the Club's website.

Acceptance of an image in the Redlands National/International Photographic Exhibition earns points towards gaining awards in the APS Honours system.

3. Point Scoring

How Club Point Scoring Works

A continuous record of each member's scored points is maintained each year. Members may inspect their score at any time convenient to the Competitions Director.

How Points Are Allocated

Internal Club Competitions

Points will be awarded each month as follows:

- One (1) point for **Entering** the set topic
- (This point is an encouragement point and is regardless of the number of images submitted in any one monthly competition)
- One (1) point for Acceptance of an image
- Two (2) points for an image deemed worthy of a **Credit** Mention.
- Three (3) points for an image deemed worthy of a **Merit** award.
- Four (4) points for an image given a **Highly Commended** award.

Please note that for special topics; example AV's, Timelapse, Themed set topics (where a maximum of one entry is submitted per member), points are doubled.

These points will be accumulated throughout the calendar year and totalled after the November Competition.

4. Annual Trophies and Awards

Prizes are awarded annually to the place winners in each Division:

- A Grade Print
- AB Grade Print
- B Grade Print
- A Grade Projected Image
- AB Grade Projected Image
- B Grade Projected Image

Prizes may also be awarded for youth sections provided there are sufficient entries to meet the criteria.

Service Awards

Medals may be awarded to members of the club who have served the club, above and beyond. The medals are awarded at the End of year Presentation and Christmas function.

Dianne Arthur Memorial Award

The perpetual DIANNE ARTHUR MEMORIAL AWARD recognises a female member who is pursuing their passion in photography at a later age in life and who is an active member of Redlands Camera Club showing effort and persistence.

Di Arthur had a love and passion for photography in her younger years, then came children and family and other commitments. Later in life Di's passion was rekindled when she joined the Redlands Camera Club, she loved photography and had a great passion at a later age in life to improve and grow in it. Di passed away suddenly, but is dearly remembered by all of the many friends within the club for her photography passion, laughter and zest for life.

Barrie Russell Memorial Award

A special trophy called THE BARRIE RUSSELL MEMORIAL AWARD is presented each year to a member who has shown great progress and who has also been a contributor to club activities.

Barry was an enthusiastic and active supporter of our Photographic Competitions and Exhibitions and a founding member of our Camera Club. While he won many awards at the Redlands Exhibitions including Champion Print, Barry is particularly remembered for his encouragement of others, his remarkable creativity and his generous spirit.

This award is made in recognition and the memory of the significant contribution Barrie made to our Club.

Allen Forbes Award

This trophy was designed to recognise the faithfulness of a person in their photographic life, support for other events of the club and assisting others where possible. The Allen Forbes trophy recognises service to the club over a period of time.

5. Affiliated Photographic Bodies

APS - AUSTRALIAN PHOTOGRAPHIC SOCIETY

APS is a national body of photographers that provides services to its members and sets standards for the accredited photographic competitions that it endorses. It is open to individual members and clubs. APS has an annual convention, APSCON, held alternately in a different state each year.
